- 250g Sultanas
- 250g chopped raisins
- 250g currants
- 125g chopped mixed peel
- 250a butter
- 250g soft brown sugar
- 4 large eggs
- 90g chopped red glace cherries
- ½ teaspoon vanilla essence
- ½ teaspoon almond essence
- 90g chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g plain flour
- 60g self -raising flour
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind
- 1/4 Teaspoon grated nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground cloves

### Here's what to do

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices.

Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into prepared tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 31/2 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Hot Tip: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

### INGREDIENTS:

375g plain flour

2tsp Baking Powder

1 ½ tsp bicarb of soda

2tsp ground cinnamon

1/2tsp ground nutmeg

1/2tsp gound allspice

2tsp salt

345g caster sugar

375ml vegetable oil

4 eggs

3 medium carrots, grated (350grams)

220g tin crushed pineapple, drained

200g pecans, chopped

### METHOD

Pre-heat the oven to 180C (160C fan)

Grease a 20cm round cake tin and line with baking paper.

Sift the dry ingredients together in a bowl. In a separate bowl beat the eggs and oil, then add the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into cake tin.

Bake for approx.. 40 minutes or until a bamboo skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.

Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 mins in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.
